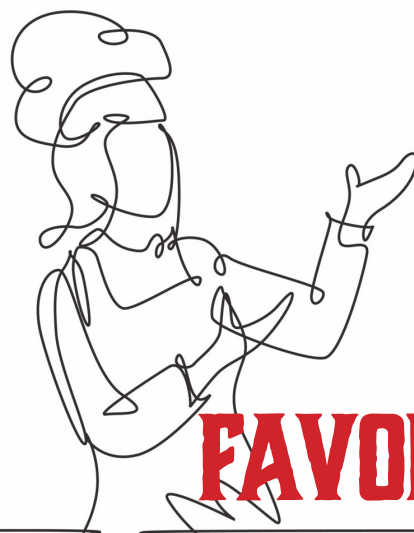


February 1 - 29

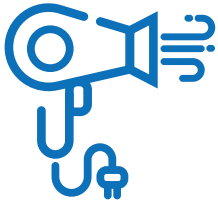
