

## Navigating the Holidays

### Tips for Managing Stress and Boosting Mental Health

The holidays can be joyful but stressful, especially with the demands of family gatherings, shopping, travel, and high expectations. Managing stress and supporting mental health during this busy season is essential to ensuring the holidays are still enjoyable.

Mindfulness practices, including meditation, yoga, and deep breathing exercises, can help reduce stress by promoting relaxation and present-moment awareness. Set aside a few minutes daily to practice deep breathing or meditate, focusing on the present rather than worrying about the past or future. Mindfulness can be used at any point in the day, in the morning for focus, during the middle of the day for stress and anxiety, or at night for better sleep quality.

Physical activity is a well-known stress reliever. Exercise can increase the release of endorphins, the brain's "happy" chemicals. Try to keep your usual exercise routine, or incorporate short, daily walks or stretching into your schedule to keep your energy levels up and reduce tension.

Lack of sleep can negatively affect mood and cognitive functioning, increasing stress levels. Prioritize sleep by setting up a calming bedtime routine and ensuring you get enough rest to stay energized and resilient during the holiday season.

The holiday season doesn't have to be a time of heightened stress. By prioritizing self-care and staying active you can reduce stress and maintain your mental well-being.
