## Building Community Through Dogs

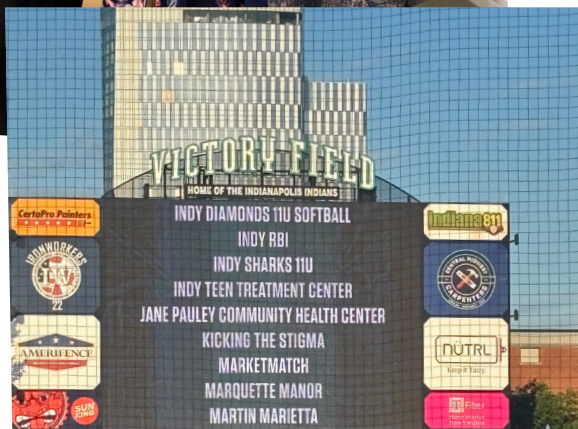
